

PE Premium and Sport Funding
2017 - 2018

At Edward Worlledge Ormiston Academy, we recognise the contribution of sport to the health, wellbeing and academic achievement of pupils. We believe that an innovative, varied curriculum and extra-curricular sporting opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and positive behaviour of all our children.

The additional funding provided from the Department for Education is a lump sum of £16,000 plus an additional £10 per pupil. Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality sporting experiences.

Uses of the funding and the expected effects:

- Providing opportunities for pupils, who otherwise would not participate, to get involved physical activity, increasing the levels of interest and uptake in sporting activities within and outside of the Academy.
- Providing sustainable extra-curricular and inter-school opportunities so our children have a wider access to sport, improving community engagement, parental involvement and raising the health benefit profile of sport; understanding the links between healthy lifestyle, physical activity and academic attainment.
- Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to work alongside and upskill our teachers so that teachers are confident to lead on and adopt an innovative approach toward physical activity at the Academy and in the community. Further this allows staff to train our pupils to develop their own leadership skills.
- Providing opportunities for children to access a wider range of inclusive sports/physical activity such as yoga. One of the desired outcomes of this approach is to increase pupils' understanding of the need to enhance a fully-inclusive society, as well as the breadth of opportunities there are for extra-curricular physical activity.

Sustainability

Our approach at Edward Worlledge Ormiston Academy to ensure improvements and developments resulting from expenditure are sustainable, is to initially conduct/commission a full impact review in order to identify where expenditure has had the most beneficial impact for pupils so that these elements can be repeated and further exploited going forward. This awareness will underpin strategy as it is devised for the next cycle. Strands will be linked directly to the Academy Development Plan to ensure that there is an ongoing focus in the clear relationship between sporting activity and performance in the classroom. This approach will also help to ensure all staff members at the Academy recognise they have a stake in this important dimension. Further, in order for our approach to be sustainable, it is equally important that our relationships will also ensure that expenditure which has generated valuable professional development for our staff is cascaded appropriately.
